4. Read Luke 12:13-21 and then discuss the parable as well as the following question.

What does a Healthy, Godly, Gospel Centered budget look like? Does your budget reflect this sort of approach to your finances? If so, share with the rest of the group what you have learned about God by living like this. If not, then what needs to change in your approach to your finances? When will you make those changes?
